IMPACT PROGRAMS

Your contributions to United Way help provide funding for these (and other) vital health and human service programs that make a difference in the lives of local citizens every day.

24 Hour Crisis Intervention

24 hour - 7 day a week Crisis Hotline and Emergency Shelter for victims of domestic violence and their children.

Adapted Programs

Land and water programs for physically and mentally challenged children and adults, allowing them to increase their physical skills and find success in living more independent lives.

After-School Programs/Summer Camps

Comprehensive youth development program, day camps and outdoor education programs serving at-risk youth.

Children's Violin Classes

Violin training classes for at-risk students, grades 1-7. Violins, materials, instruction, and repairs are provided for the children.

Community Cupboard

Food pantry for individuals and families infected with HIV/AIDS.

Counseling and Casework/In-home Senior Companion Program

Information, access, guidance, referral, and assistance to allow senior citizens to remain safely at home. Also, offers community education, etc. on a wide variety of subject matters pertaining to the elderly or disabled.

Crisis Counseling/Intervention/Prevention Education

Crisis intervention and counseling services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for victims of sexual assault and their families who are in need of services, medical accompaniment, legal advocacy, and outreach services.

Disaster Preparation and Relief

Emergency assistance to meet immediate needs for families affected by disaster and to alleviate undue hardship and suffering.

Emergency Shelter/Job Skills Training

A safe place to sleep at night, including dinner and breakfast for homeless men, women and children. Through individual life assessments, case management, goal setting, and job skills training, assist them in becoming self-sufficient, productive citizens.

Income-Based Child Care

Childcare that allows parents to work knowing their children are being cared for in safe and healthy surroundings.

Individual and Family Counseling

Individual, couple and family counseling services with the goal of improving individual and family functionality.

Mentoring

Individual, class or group mentors who serve as an adult friend or community partner to students in grades PreK-12.

Rehabilitation for Chronic Mental Illness

Peer support center for members recovering from emotional and mental disorders.

Sheltered Employment for the Handicapped

Employment opportunities for persons with mental retardation and/or developmental disabilities.

Speech and Hearing Services

Education and quality care (evaluation and treatment) for all individuals with speech, language, swallowing, and hearing needs, regardless of their socio-economic circumstance.

Support Groups and Education

Life Skill Classes, Parenting Classes, and Support Groups for domestic violence clients.

Teen Leadership Training

Leadership initiative for middle school, high school and alternative school students. Includes a two-week summer leadership camp with motivational workshops that focus on building self-esteem, leadership skills, community involvement, and personal accountability.

Traditional Scouting/Special Needs Scouting/Scouting Scholarships

Scholarship assistance for Scouting programs designed to teach a young person to reach their full potential through growth in citizenship, character development and physical fitness. Provide non-traditional programs adapted to meet the needs of youth who would not otherwise be able to easily participate in traditional Scouting programs.

Traveling Troop/Outreach Program

Year-round educational Girl Scout program that reaches over 700 girls throughout the CSRA, many from single-parent, low socio-economic families.

A variety of sport activities which allows children to develop new physical and emotional skills.

Promoting Health and Wellness: Every person in our community will have the opportunity to achieve optimal health and wellness.

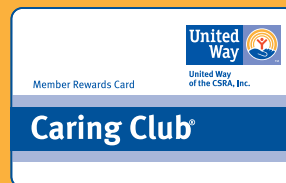
Providing Basic Needs: Residents will have their basic needs met for food, shelter and safety.
